Donations are not required, though the suggested stipend from the Pastoral Handbook is \$10, which is later paid to the priest offering the Liturgy. (These donations are probably not tax-deductible and are not included in your tax-deductible letter.)

Eastern Catholic Formation (ECF) registration: It's time to register your children for youth catechetical classes for the 2023-24 school year. Registration forms can be found in the Narthex and on the gift shop display case. It is <u>very important</u> that you meet the deadline of returning registration forms <u>no later than **next** Sunday, September 10</u>, so we know how many classes and teachers we need. Our first day of Sunday School instruction (equivalent to CCD) will be on Sunday, September 24. Instructors usually start class about 12 or 12:30pm depending on the instructor. Details on books and instructors will be coming soon.
