LITURGY INTENTONS Please fill out one of the Liturgy Intention envelopes on the greeting table in the narthex with the name of your living or deceased person. Make checks payable to **St. Anne Stipends** and write "Liturgy Stipend" in your memo line. Donations are not required, though the suggested stipend from the Pastoral Handbook is \$10, which is later paid to the priest offering the Liturgy. (These donations are probably not tax-deductible and are not included in your tax-deductible letter.)

Eastern Catholic Formation (ECF) registration: It's time to register your children for youth catechetical classes for the 2023-24 school year. Registration forms can be found in the Narthex and on the gift shop display case. It is <u>very important</u> that you meet the deadline of returning registration forms <u>no later than this Sunday, September 10</u>, so we know how many classes and teachers we need. Our first day of Sunday School instruction (equivalent to CCD) will be on Sunday, September 24. Instructors usually start class about 12 or 12:30pm depending on the instructor. Details on books and instructors will be coming soon.

Volunteer Group Safe Environment Training on September 17: For St Anne's volunteers who help in various capacities (except for occasionally bringing coffee social food), our annual Virtus training will be given next Sunday, September 17, from 12:30 - 1:45pm in the social hall. This will enable volunteers who prefer to do the training in a group and in person, the opportunity to do so. Otherwise, you will need to complete the training online. Please see Fr. Michael or Sean Baird if you have questions.

Acolyte training session (Part 2):

On Saturday, September 16, there will be a training session (as a continuation of the session held in August) at 9:30am, Divine Liturgy at 11:00am (to give extra practice for what we just learned), and a pizza lunch at 12:15pm. Acolytes are male altar servers: boys and men. Our age range is 7 to 75.

This gathering aims to increase the appreciation of the Byzantine Ruthenian Church's history (both in the "Old Country" and the United States) and Byzantine Ruthenian art and culture.
