# Historic Gathering of the Byzantine Catholic Church in America

The registration deadline is October 1, so it's time to sign up for this historic gathering.

This gathering aims to increase the appreciation of the Byzantine Ruthenian Church's history (both in the "Old Country" and the United States) and Byzantine Ruthenian art and culture. The second goal of the assembly is to learn about the best practices occurring in our parishes today, which are contributing to the growth of our communities, with the hope that the attendees will

incorporate this information into their parish activities. A third goal is to develop concrete steps to ensure the future and growth of our Church. The synodal meetings revealed these three topics to be the most important to those participating.

The Assembly will include lectures, discussions, fellowship, and a gala dinner with folk music and dancing. The fee includes meals, breaks, presentations, materials, and the gala on Saturday evening.

The clergy track will be presented on Thursday and Friday, November 2nd and 3rd, and a laity tract will occur from Friday to Sunday, November 3rd to 5th. Fr. Michael will be attending, so it would be great for you to join him at the track for the laity.
