Even though every parish pays a monthly premium to the eparchy for medical insurance, our premiums do not cover the entire cost of the insurance. As a result, the eparchy incurs a deficit each month. This special collection helps to reduce the severity of that deficit. Usher Training: We would like all of our adult acolytes (adult altar servers) and as many adult parishioner dads and other adult parishioners as possible to be present for this orientation class taught by Roy Aguirre on Sunday, October 29, from 12:30 to 1pm. This will give time for us to eat at the Agape Meal (aka Coffee Social) which happens to also be a Potluck Sunday.

The plan is that on Sundays in which our normal rotation of ushers is not available, we will first ask a couple of adult acolytes to serve as ushers that Sunday instead of at the altar. If even most of them are out of town, then we will ask two dads who are trained as ushers to serve that Sunday. It will therefore be rare that we need a dad of young children to help in this manner, but being trained in this capacity will keep everything running smoothly on such rare days.
