House Blessings: It's time to schedule your house blessing. Every year the priest blesses the homes of parishioners who want this during the period after Theophany on January 6 until before the Great Fast begins (on February 12, 2024). This is an annual Byzantine Catholic Tradition. If you would like Fr. Michael to bless your home, please return a form (found in the narthex or social hall) no later than Sunday, December 31.

Saying goodbye to the Baron Family: A long-time family is departing for Tennessee at the beginning of January. We wish the Baron Family well on this new chapter of their lives. Your last day to say goodbye is December 31.

Christmas collection envelope: This year we are not selecting a special charity to give 10 or 20% of our Christmas collection to because we are the charity this year. SUNDAY AFTER CHRISTMAS. MEMORY OF THE HOLY AND JUST JOSEPH HUSBAND OF MARY; OF DAVID, PROPHET AND KING; AND OF THE HOLY APOSTLE JAMES, THE BROTHER OF THE LORD – December 31st, 2023 "Out of Egypt I have called my son." The righteous Joseph the betrothed was faithful to his calling, protecting Jesus and the Theotokos by journeying to Egypt and returning to Nazareth. THEOPHANY (Feast of the Baptism of Our Lord): The feast of Theophany is historically considered an even more exalted and higher feast day than Christmas. At the vigil, Fr. Michael blesses 10 gallons of water, which usually last about a year. We will have a Vigil Vesperal Divine Liturgy at 5:30pm on Friday, January 5, and another Divine Liturgy at 10am on Friday, January 6.

Bring your bottle or jar to fill with Holy Water: Every year, the Great Blessing of Holy Water takes place during the feast of Theophany at the vigil. Come bring empty bottles or jars.

Great Blessing of Water: This year Fr. Michael will bless the water at Avila Beach on Sunday, January 7, at 1:30pm. Everyone is welcome to meet at the Avila Beach Pier.

The Feast of the Theophany

The feast of the Theophany of our Lord, God and Savior Jesus Christ is part of the cycle of winter feasts that are sometimes called the "Feasts of Light". These feasts -- the Nativity, Theophany, and Meeting - have a common focus: the coming of the Messiah into the world, and the beginning of His work of redemption.

This feast is celebrated on January 6, and is counted one of the Twelve Great Feasts of the church. In the Byzantine Catholic Church, it is a holyday of obligation.

Meaning of the Feast

Theophany is very much a multi-faceted feast; among its many themes:

- The coming of the Savior as "enlightenment" and "revelation"
- Baptism the cleansing of sin by water and the Spirit
- The regeneration of the natural world by the Savior's coming
- The revelation of the Holy Trinity

Divine Liturgy for the Theophany of our Lord, a Holy Day of Obligation: 10am

(Readings: Titus 2:11-14, 3:4-7; Matthew 3:13-17.)

This all-night vigil will be a period of intense supplication on this Great Feast of Theophany. We will be praying through the Book of Psalms during the night. Half of each hour will be spent praying the Psalter while the other half will be silent contemplative prayer for participants.

Vigil sign-up: at least two people must register per hour. Please note: Children and teens under age 18 are welcome and encouraged to join in the prayer. However, at least one parent or two unrelated adults must be present in the church while a minor or minors are present.
