# **CREATE YOUR LIST OF NAMES--All Souls Saturdays**

Get your list of names together. Read previous bulletins or the Late-Night Vigil announcement for more information.

Time to use up any meat you have on hand: Byzantine Catholics begin the Great Fast (Lent) two days earlier than Roman Catholics because the period of paschal preparation is structured differently in the two traditions. Byzantine Catholics have two major fasting periods in preparation for Pascha (Easter). The first 40-day period, called the Great Fast, begins seven Mondays before Pascha Sunday and ends the Friday before Lazarus Saturday (the day before Palm Sunday). This period includes Sundays, which explains why there is only a mitigation for wine and oil on Sundays and special feast days in the traditional fast. The **minimum required** by our Byzantine Catholic bishops is to abstain from meat on all Wednesdays and Fridays throughout the Great Fast and to abstain from meat and dairy on Pure Monday (February 12 this year) and on Good Friday. Byzantine Catholics then celebrate a second intense fasting period, from Holy Monday to the Divine Liturgy of Pascha Sunday. Traditionally, during the weekend between the two fasting periods, namely Lazarus Saturday and Palm Sunday, meat and dairy are allowed. By contrast, the Latin (Roman) Catholic Church has a single 40-day fasting period from Ash Wednesday to Holy Saturday, the day before Easter. There are actually 46 days in this period, but Sundays are counted as "an island in the fast" and therefore not included in the 40 days. Building discipline with food helps us say no to sin, and reminds us of our hunger for God (Matthew 4:4). In order for any abstinence to be fruitful, we must accompany it with additional prayer and almsgiving.

**LITURGY INTENTONS** Please fill out one of the Liturgy Intention envelopes on the greeting table in the narthex with the name of your living or deceased person. Make checks payable to **St. Anne Stipends** and write "Liturgy Stipend" in your memo line. Donations are not required, though the suggested stipend from the Pastoral Handbook is \$10, which is later paid to the priest offering the Liturgy. (These donations are probably not tax-deductible and are not included in your tax-deductible letter.)

# **During the Night:**

7:00pm – 9am: Late-Night Vigil

#### Saturday, February 3

Confessions: 9-9:30am

First All Souls Saturday Divine Liturgy at 10am

This late-night vigil will be a period of intense supplication. We will be praying through the Book of Psalms during the night. Half of each hour will be spent praying the Psalter while the other half will be silent contemplative prayer for participants.

**First All Souls Saturday** – Please bring a list of no more than 30 deceased loved ones to the Divine Liturgy on Saturday, February 3. Your loved ones will be prayed for by name for those in attendance who bring a list.

**Vigil sign-up:** We need at least two people each hour. Please sign up for the earliest hour that does not yet have two people signed up. For example, do not sign up for 2am if 7pm -11pm does not have at least 2 people per hour. Please note: Children and teens under age 18 are welcome and encouraged to join in the prayer. However, at least one parent or two unrelated adults must be present in the church while a minor or minors are present.
