SUNDAY OF ORTHODOXY: February 18 this year (next Sunday)

The Sunday of Orthodoxy is a celebration of the Triumph of the True Faith regarding icons. Even though the 7th Ecumenical Council in 787 AD settled the truth regarding icons, that they are not idols, but rather a vehicle to the holy saints depicted in them, it was not until 843 AD that the battle to restore icons to the churches was realized in the Byzantine Empire. It was celebrated with a procession of icons in that year and the tradition has continued ever since. Remember to bring an icon from home for our procession for the Divine Liturgy next Sunday.
