
<u>Three Conceptions</u>: On March 25, we celebrate the Feast the Annunciation of the Theotokos. This is one of three conceptions we celebrate over the course of the Church



year. Only Jesus has a perfect nine-month period between the celebration of His conception (March 25) and birth (December 25). The Feast of the Conception of John the Baptist (September 23) is separated by nine months and one day from the Feast of John the Forerunner's Birth is June 24. The Mother of God's, the Immaculate Conception, is celebrated on December 9, and her birth on September 8; hence, nine months minus one day. Only here in the United States do we celebrate Mary's conception on December 8 to share the feast with our Roman Catholic brothers and

sisters since Our Lady of the Immaculate Conception is the Patroness of our country.


