

**NOT A SEASON FOR KNEELING:** (Adapted from the Metropolitan Cantor Institute) According to the decision of the First Ecumenical Council at Nicaea in 325 AD, the Church fathers recommended in Canon 20 that Christians should not kneel for prayer on the Lord's Day (Sunday) or on the days from Pascha to Pentecost, in honor of the Lord's Resurrection. Thus, we refrain from kneeling in our Byzantine churches during this whole Paschal season from Pascha Sunday through until the Kneeling Prayers on Pentecost Sunday.
