LITURGY INTENTIONS Please use the envelopes available on the greeting table in the narthex and fill it out for your living or deceased person. For checks, make sure to write it out to **St. Anne Stipends** and write "Liturgy Stipend" in your memo line. These donations are not required but a suggested stipend which is later paid to the priest offering the Liturgy.

Thinking ahead to the Great Fast: Looking at the calendar, you will see we are three weeks plus one day away from the beginning of the Great Fast. Now is a good time to start asking ourselves what we will do differently during the Great Fast. The minimum required is to abstain from meat on all Wednesdays and Fridays of the Great fast and to abstain from meat and dairy on Pure Monday (March 4 this year) and on Good Friday (April 19 this year). The Traditional fast is to abstain from meat, dairy, wine, and oil throughout the full 40 days. Days of mitigation in the Traditional fast are Sundays and feast days such as March 25 in which wine and oil are allowed. We are encouraged to do more than the minimum yet also what our health will allow. It should feel uncomfortable but not kill us off. Building this discipline with food helps us say no to sin and recognize our hunger for God. Also during the Great Fast we should be we increasing our prayer life and almsgiving.

Meatfare Week: If following the full traditional Fast, this is the time to eat up your meat in preparation for the Great Fast (Lent). The week after that, Cheesefare Week, is the time to eat up all your dairy products in the fridge. This prepares the pantry and fridge to be ready for the full Traditional Fast listed in the announcement above.

Advisory Council members confirmed: When there is a change of pastor, the existing Advisory Council generally ceases after about three months. According to our eparchy's Pastoral Handbook, the new pastor can nominate members from the previous term or can nominate all different members to the Council or can nominate a mixture of new and previous members. Then the Eparchial Bishop confirms the names of those whom the pastor nominates. Fr. Michael took some quality time to get to know parishioners and meet with the previous Advisory Council a couple times before making this decision. Our Apostolic Administrator Bishop Thomas Olmsted has confirmed Fr. Michael's nominees to the Parish Advisory Council: Christina Aguirre, Jeffrey Baron, Joyce Dicky, Ames Elmendorf, Gregory Lee, Paul Santos, Paul Sawko, James Snead, and Edward Stewart. We thank them for their willingness to serve in this capacity at St. Anne's for the next three-year term which began in January 2019.
