St. John Chrysostom regarding Old Testament prophesy: Christ would work miracles and teach as soon as he came to well-known sections of his own country, and this, too, had been foretold. Listen to the words of Isaiah when he said: "The district of Zabulun, the land of Napthali, a people who were sitting in darkness saw a great light; upon those sitting in darkness and the shadow of death a light arose." [Isaiah 8:23] In these words Isaiah revealed that Christ came to those places, that he taught in the lands of Zabulun and Napthali, and that he was recognized by the wonders he wrought. [Matthew 4: 15-16]

And Isaiah went on to tell of other marvels and showed how Christ cured the lame, how he made the blind to see, and the mute to speak: "Then will the eyes of the blind be opened, then will the ears of the deaf hear." [Isaiah 35:5] And thereafter he spoke of the other marvels: "Then will the lame man leap like a stag, and the tongue of those with impediments of speech will be clear and distinct." [Mt 11:5, Mk 7:37, Lk 7:22] And this did not happen until his coming.
