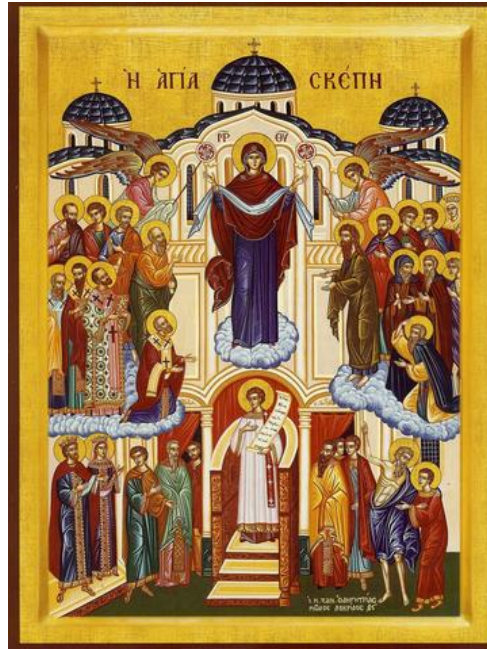

Prayer for the Catholic Church and our country – There is much to pray about in these days since the vile, evil clerical abuse cases and evidence of cover-up came to light this past summer. There is much that is needed for accountability and healing in the Catholic Church and prayer is an essential ingredient to the process. We also have mid-term elections coming up which need God's guidance to the truth and inspiration in the hearts of voters across the country in how to vote. Obviously well formed consciences are needed in the process but prayer can help here as well. October 1 is the feast of the Protection of the Mother of God. According to the Prologue of Ohrid, there was an All Night Vigil on October 1, 911 in which Our Lady appeared to St. Andrew the Fool-for-Christ and his disciple Epiphaneus. Mary held her omophorion over the people in the Blachernae church in Constantinople where the people were praying. In this, she communicated that she heard their prayers and was interceding for them. Let us, inspired by the people of the church in Blachernae, also offer our prayers in an All Night Vigil. The main prayers will take place from 5-10pm in church with a break for supper on September 30. Then adults and families will take turns from 10pm on September 30 to 7am on October 1 to pray for an hour or more in the church. This will be followed by Festal Matins at 7:30am and Divine Liturgy at 9:00am. Confessions will be available 4:15-4:45pm and 7:30-8:00pm on Sept. 30 and by appointment. For those that cannot make it, Divine Liturgy will be held at 6:30pm on October 1 as well. Please see the sign up sheet in church and consider being part of this prayer for the Church and our nation.
