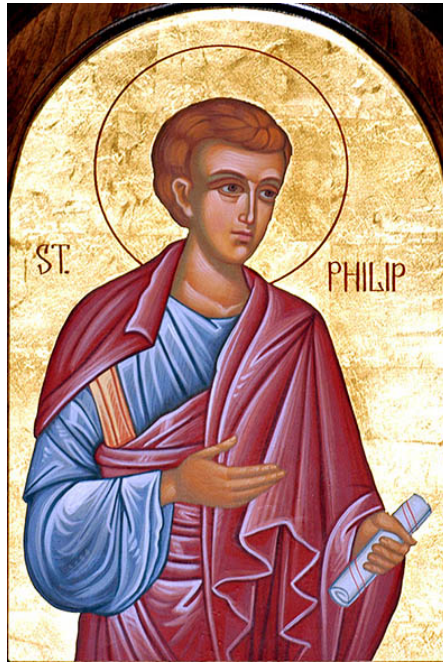

Great Resources for Byzantine Catholic prayer and spiritual reading— In the last several years, many helpful resources have been created for Byzantine Catholics. To access the daily readings and the Saint(s) of the Day as well as other resources, download the *ParmaByz* app to your phone or tablet.

If you want to pray Daily Vespers (evening prayer traditionally prayed near time of sunset) with all the changeable parts from each day, visit *Eastern Christian Publications* and sign up for Daily Vespers for free: <https://ecpubs.com/byzantine-daily-office-bdo/> You can also purchase some great books and resources on Byzantine Catholic Liturgy and spirituality on the *Eastern Christian Publications* website. The Vespers can also be found through the *ECPubs* app available for download on your phone or tablet. Unless you are a priest or a deacon, use the ones designed as a "Reader Service" for when you have no priest praying with you. Learning to pray the Divine Praises (Byzantine terminology for the Divine Office) regularly according to our ability helps us grow in virtue and spiritual progress.

PHILIP'S FAST: It is the tradition of our Byzantine Catholic Church to fast in preparation for Christmas beginning November 15. Although the fast is optional, the season is penitential in our Ruthenian Metropolia in America. The traditional fast is to abstain from meat and dairy all days of the fast through Christmas Eve's Holy Supper, and to abstain from wine and oil on Monday, Wednesday and Friday. The minimum fasting required by the Church for most of the year is abstinence from meat on Fridays since Jesus died on the Cross on Good Friday. Eating no meat on Wednesday is also encouraged throughout most of the year as the betrayal of Judas began two days before Good Friday. We are encouraged to prepare for Christmas by doing MORE than the minimum our Ruthenian Church requires. Fasting helps us empty ourselves of sin to make room for God in our hearts. For this reason, our fast must be accompanied by prayer. Prayer and fasting will bear fruit in great spiritual joy on the glorious feast of the birth of our Savior. So let's get ready!
