Next Special Collection for Retired Religious: In a few weeks, we will be taking of the Retirement Fund for Religious (RFR) on December 13. The RFR began in 1988 and provides funding to any U.S. Catholic religious institute listed in the Official Catholic Directory (OCD) and that has an unfunded past service liability. It distributes direct care, planning and implementation assistance from the fund to religious institutes based on criteria approved by the conferences of major superiors and bishops. All of the proceeds of this special collection go to the National Religious Retirement Office.

Patience: Christ the Bridegroom Monastery is a Byzantine Catholic monastery for women located in Burton, Ohio. One of the nuns, Mother Cecelia, recounts a priest's lesson and reflection on learning patience while staying at the monastery on retreat:

On the first day of the re-roofing of our chapel, a Roman Catholic priest was here in one of our poustinias for a day of silence and solitude. In the morning, he celebrated Mass for us in our chapel. The noise above our heads, from the scraping off of the old shingles, was so loud that we could hardly hear each other! In his homily, the priest said, "This is the first time I've celebrated Mass while the roof is being removed above me!" The noise was constant throughout the Liturgy, except for the moment when the priest elevated the consecrated host. As soon as the host was above his head, all sound ceased, and then the noise resumed when he placed the host back down on the paten. It seemed that the power of God's presence in the Eucharist, held up in the air, caused "every knee to bow (Phil 2:10)," and the silence of God was made tangible amidst the noise of earth for just a moment. Later that day, when the priest-retreatant came over to the monastery to say goodbye, I apologized for all of the noise that happened as he was trying to pray that day. He said it wasn't as loud in the poustinia as it had been in the chapel, and it didn't ruin his day. The Lord had used the situation to reveal something to his heart. The priest explained, "If I lived here, I would have wanted to do all of the renovations immediately. But you had to do them slowly, over the course of ten years. That takes a lot of patience! In our spiritual lives, we want everything to happen all at once, but we have to have patience."
