**Avoid eating round foods on August 29:** This is a day that is not so much of a celebration as it is a sad reminder of what sin and corruption can bring about in our fallen human race. It is the commemoration of the beheading of St. John the Baptist. By tradition, no meat or dairy is eaten on this day. Other traditions tell us not to eat food from a plate or eat anything round because we do not want to eat anything that would imitate the shape of a head. To follow this tradition, try to avoid apples and cabbage and instead look for cucumbers and bananas.
