Eparchial Priests Health Insurance Collection: Next Sunday, October 18, there will an Eparchial special collection to support our pastors and their families by helping pay their health insurance premiums. Each parish pays \$1,250 per month to the Eparchy for these health insurance premiums but this is not enough to pay the premiums. This special collection helps offset this shortage. God bless your support and generosity!

Eparchial Appeal update: As of October 9, a total of 21 families from St. Anne's have contributed \$9,325.75 toward our \$9,961.09 goal in 2020 for our parish. We are 93.6% toward reaching our goal. The Eparchy is assessing our families about \$356 per family/household this year. The Eparchy will be closing the Appeal at the end of October, leaving the last Sunday to donate at October 25.
