**Praying throughout the Day: (3 of 4 daily prayer resource bulletin inserts)**

Trisagion Prayer description

*"Trisagion" means "Thrice Holy," and refers to the "Holy God, Holy and Mighty, Holy and Immortal..." prayer included in this prayer series. The Trisagion Prayers typically introduce most Byzantine Catholic liturgical services and are then called the "Typical Beginning Prayers." They always conclude with either the "Our Father" or the "Call to Prayer" (Come, let us worship our King and God...)*

Trisagion Prayers (also called Usual Beginning Prayers):

Through the prayers of our holy fathers, O Lord Jesus Christ our God, have mercy on us. Amen.

Glory to you, our God, glory to you.

Heavenly King Comforter, Spirit of Truth, everywhere present and filling all things, Treasury of Blessings and Giver of Life, come and dwell within us, cleanse us of all stain, and save our souls, O gracious one.

*(Throughout Pascha, the following is said instead of "Glory to you" and "Heavenly King":*

*Christ is risen from the dead! By death he trampled Death; and to those in the tombs he granted life. (Three times))*

Holy God, Holy and Mighty, Holy and Immortal, have mercy on us (Three times)

Glory to the Father and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever and forever. Amen

Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name; thy kingdom come; thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who have trespassed against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.

(Priest): For thine is the kingdom and power and the glory, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, now and ever and forever. Amen.

*(Some traditions such as ours omit this "doxology" if there is not a priest present to say it.)*

Lord, have mercy. (Twelve times)

Glory to the Father, and to the Son, and to the Holy Spirit, now and ever and forever. Amen.

Come, let us worship our King and God.

Come, let us worship Christ, our King and God.

Come, let us worship and bow before the only Lord Jesus Christ the King and our God.
