March for Conversation--October 18: Our next march is on October 18. Please join if you can.

Funeral for Jay Dicky: We will have a funeral for long-time parishioner Jay Dicky on Friday, October 9 and Saturday, October 10 (see schedule). He fell asleep in the Lord on October 1. Please keep him and his family in your prayers and come to the funeral if able.

Coast-to-Coast Rosary on Sunday, October 11: You can participate in this important prayer event at 1 PM at St Anne’s and a few other Catholic Churches in the area. In addition, a group will pray at the courthouse on the Monterey Street side in downtown San Luis Obispo. We begin gathering at 12:30pm. I encourage you to come and pray with us.

Praying the Psalms: (1 of 4 daily prayer resource)

The Psalms are the prayer book of the church. According to tradition, all 150 psalms are prayed every week. This is done by grouping the psalms into sections called “Kathismata” and chanting one or more Kathismata during the various liturgies celebrated throughout the day. (The psalms vary greatly in length. This system takes this into consideration and assigns generally the same number of verses per section.) This weekly cycle is usually only done in monasteries, but it is important for all Christians to pray the psalms. One way to incorporate this tradition in a way that isn’t overwhelming is to break up the Kathisma further. Notice below that each Kathisma is broken up into three sections (plural “stases”). If you pray one stasis everyday (psalms 1-3 on the first day, 4-6 on the second day etc.) you will pray all 150 psalms in 60 days.
