Next Sunday is Potluck Sunday

Next Sunday is the feast of the Dormition of St. Anne, the mother of Mary the Theotokos. As such, we will celebrate our parish patroness and also the fact that we have had this parish building for 30 years and began as a parish 35 years ago. We thank the Lord for the gift of St. Anne's in our lives and will celebrate with a parish potluck that day.

Commemoration of the first Six Ecumenical Councils

On the Sunday from July 13-19, we commemorate the first six Ecumenical Councils of the Universal Church. Here is a brief listing of when and what they dealt with:

- 1st in Nicaea in 325: Refuted Arian heresy and affirmed Jesus is Son of God. The first part of the creed is composed.
 - 2nd in Constantinople in 381: Refuted heresy of Macedonius and affirmed Holy Spirit is God. The second part of creed is composed.
 - 3rd in Ephesus in 431: Refuted heresy of Nestorius and affirmed Mary is the Mother of God.
 - 4th in Chalcedon in 451: Refuted Monophysite heresy and affirmed Jesus is one person with two natures: Divine and human. These natures are distinct, unconfused, and in perfect harmony.
 - 5th in Constantinople in 553: Condemned errors of Origen and certain writings of others such as Theodoret, Theodore of Mopsuestia, and of Ibas. Reconfirmed first four councils.
- 6th in Constantinople: Refuted the Monothelite heresy and confirmed Christ has two wills: Divine and human which are distinct, unconfused, and in perfect harmony with one another.
