Holy Day: Beheading of St. John the Baptist on August 29: On Monday, we have a holy day though not exactly a joyous feast day. Because of what we are commemorating, it is traditional to not only abstain from meat and dairy, but also avoid eating round foods such as apples, cabbage, and melons and also to avoid eating food from a plate. Think creatively. Maybe soup in a bowl?

REGISTRATION DUE TODAY--Eastern Catholic Formation Program (ECF): As St Anne's begins the 2022-2023 catechetical year for our children, please register your child (children) by the end of August. We need to know how many plan to attend classes, and their ages, so our catechist teachers can set up the grade levels. Registration forms are available in the narthex and social hall, and are due TODAY (August 28). Talk to Fr. Michael if you have questions. First day of ECF classes to be determined soon.

Reminder: Morning Divine Liturgies at 7:30am: Starting this week, we will begin our weekday non-festal daily liturgical services 7:30am. On feast days, we will usually continue to have them at 10am in the morning. We may end up adjusting the start time to a little earlier if that works better, but we will start with 7:30am on Wednesday, August 31.

Happy New Year!! In Byzantine reckoning from the age of the Byzantine Empire, this is the year 7531. Every liturgical year in the Byzantine Catholic Church begins on September 1 and ends August 31.

Byzantine Tidbits: When making the sign of the cross, Byzantines place the thumb, index finger, and middle finger together and place the ring finger and small finger on the base of the thumb (see photo). We make three small bows when making the sign of the cross at the tetrapod. In a small bow, we bend half or a third of the way to the ground before or after making the sign of the cross. With a profound bow, we bend all the way to touch our fingers to the ground before making the sign of the cross. It is good to make a profound bow when we enter and exit the nave and especially when we enter and exit the sanctuary. Liturgical books will also sometimes indicate other appropriate times to do this.
