Dispensation from Abstinence on Friday after Thanksgiving: Our Apostolic Administrator Bishop Thomas Olmsted has granted the whole Eparchy a dispensation from abstinence from meat the day after Thanksgiving, Friday November 25.

Special collection on Dec. 4—Retired Religious: Every year, Catholic parishes across the country take up a special collection for the retired monks, nuns, and priest monks who have devoted their lives to prayer and ministry—educating the young, tending the sick, aiding the needy, and more. Yet despite having given much, many of them do not have enough retirement savings to pay the bills and put food on the table. This annual collection helps. If you wish to donate, special envelopes were included in your mailings or you can fill out a blank envelope with label: Retired Religious. If writing a check, please make it out to St. Anne B.C. Church and write "RFR" in the memo line. This collection will take place on Sunday, December 4, though you may donate to this no later than the next Sunday, Dec. 11.

Priest Medical Insurance collection in 2022: Thank you—Through your generosity, we collected \$1,640 to help lessen the difference between what each parish pays to the Eparchy each month versus what the actual cost of the premium which is higher than what each parish pays.
